I was invited to lecture and write with ThinkCLIMA (2016-2017) at Universitat Pompeu Fabra Barcelona (<https://www.upf.edu/web/thinkclima>), staying for two weeks with a colleague. In Italy I was taken on a two week publisher’s tour to introduce *Eating Earth*, freshly translated into Italian

(2016). Writing and speaking invitations are more than I can keep up with, particularly in Europe.

Research as an MSUB scholar has taken me to Brazil, Kenya, Peru, Poland, the Netherlands, Cambodia, India and across the United States several times over. Most significantly, I traveled to Peru, Kenya, Cambodia, and various nations across Europe and North America. Fall 2018 I stayed in convents and monasteries in Belgium to explore power, ritual, and sexism in Christianity. In Kenya I worked in the field to research best practices for preserving wildlife *and* cultures in the hill country around wildlife preserves (reflected in a handful of publications, including “Ecofeminism, Climate Change, and Outreach” and “Africa, Animals, and the Almighty”). In Peru I worked in the field with conservation activists laboring to protect highly endangered yellow-tailed woolley monkeys (published in *Primate People*). In Cambodia I visited both bear and an elephant sanctuaries (published in *Bear Necessities*). I also gathered information for a comparative analysis of the effectiveness of various animal rescue efforts in the U.S. (published as “Limited Funds: Assessing Rescues and Sanctuaries”).

I began learning through travels long before I was hired at MSUB. I earned my doctorate in Scotland, during which time I explored history and art in France, Italy, and Spain. I toured Austria, Germany, and France with a classical choir. After I earned my undergraduate degree, a Watson Fellowship took me overseas to explore the place of women and nonhuman animals in various religious traditions. I visited remote monasteries in Northern China (including Tibetan regions) and studied for one month in H.H. Dalai Lama’s school in Dharamsala, India. I traveled alone through poverty-ridden Bangladesh, visited a hospital in the West Bank, stayed in the homes of Palestinians, spent time in the waters and mountains of Egypt and Turkey, and explored holy sites in Israel.

Before I completed my undergraduate degree, my sister and I traveled Asia. We scrambled over an 18,000 foot pass in Nepal with only a sweater and tennis shoes... and no map. My understanding of time was changed by the quiet villages in Burma, India, and China. My idea of “necessities” was rearranged when all of my sister’s things (including her passport) were stolen in India. (Who would be foolish enough to sleep under the stars on a beach with all of their belongings?) Reconnecting with Western civilization as I traveled from India and China into Hong Kong, Taiwan, and Japan caused me to long for the terraced ridges of Nepal and animal preserves of India.

While still a teenager, I hitchhiked in foreign lands, particularly the South Pacific, staying as a guest in hundreds of homes. Through travels, I was exposed to a plethora of different points of view and ways of life, discovering that any way of living is but one among many. I also came to see how amazing Earth is. Through travel I began to seriously explore religions and different philosophies of life and the world of nature: I would not be who I am if not for early and ongoing travels.
